On June 4th our Year 10 student's engaged in powerful experiential workshops to question and challenge modern masculinity and femininity respectively with Tomorrow Man & Tomorrow Woman.

Our boys identified old-school male stereotypes and redefined a more positive version of masculinity to live by. They collectively created a space that was safe and non-judgemental to allow them to build emotional muscle, practice talking with gravity, depth and emotionally intensity.

The girls shared lived experiences of the impossible-to-achieve ideals of women now amplified by our overly connected world. They challenged traditional gender values like beauty and compliance entrenched in mainstream culture and shared the struggles to create and freely express your own identity.

The feedback that all students provided highlighted the relevance and value of the workshops, collectively expressing their surprise and gratitude for the increased connection with their peers.


Bibbulmun Track Hike
