#### **Tomorrow Man and Woman**

Tomorrow Man & Woman returned to York District High School for their second year on Wednesday May 4<sup>th</sup>. This time, thanks to additional community support, we were able to offer these powerful experiences to both Year 9 and 10s.

This entry level experiential workshop disrupts old-school gender stereotypes and redefines a more positive vision to live by. Our male and female team of facilitators created a safe and non-judgemental environment to build emotional muscle, practicing the capacity to talk with gravity, about things with weight and depth and emotional intensity.

Our students left the rooms with strengthened resilience, self-confidence, and connectedness to their peer group.

Both workshops had different experiences but there has been powerful common feedback. "I didn't know my peers as well as I thought I did", "I'm not alone in the way I'm feeling", and "I'm surrounded by people with the capacity to be brave".

The programs align with our Be You mental health initiative, and we are hopeful that with the continued support of the community, we can continue to offer these powerful and highly relevant workshops.
